Auxiliary Outreach

This December, volunteer opportunities include helping with food banks and soup kitchens, sorting and distributing toys for programs like <u>Toys for Tots</u>, assisting homeless shelters, and physically participating in gift drives. You can also find local needs through volunteer centers, food banks, shelters, other charities and by directly contacting organizations.

Qualifying activity: Any activity that is approved at a regular meeting to assist a community organization with their function. Example: Auxiliary 1234 assisted Joe County food pantry by sorting, packing, and delivering food baskets to needy families. Members are providing their labor for an organization not affiliated with the VFW or Auxiliary.

Non-Qualifying activity: Hosting an event for the good of the community, collecting gifts, providing a meal. Example: Auxiliary 2345 held a toy drive for unfortunate children in Sally County. Members donated toys, money, and prepared and served a meal to volunteers. Members provided goods, and monetary donations to the community through their own event. This should be reported as community service.

Awards for Auxiliaries: Citation and \$25 to one VFW Auxiliary in each of the 10 Program Divisions that shares the most outstanding Auxiliary Outreach activity and/or event using #AuxiliaryOutreach during the current Program Year. Entry form is required and available in MALTA Member Resources.



- This is the first year that this tool was developed and made available to the Auxiliary.
 It was created as a way to let an Auxiliary take responsibility for planning the "how,"
 "who" and "when" to resolve problems.
- Taking ownership of a problem, setting goals, and mapping out a timeline results in a problem resolution plan that benefits the Auxiliary.
- More is accomplished when we are able to work things out for ourselves. That's the goal of a PIP - but with a mentor or mediator appointed to provide feedback and support.
- The Department President selects a person or team to aid in the decisions and discussion with the Auxiliary.
- The Auxiliary will be responsible for crafting a plan to become healthy again.
- January 2026 Communications will provide more detailed information on PIP.

Bottom line - our veterans benefit when we work smarter and together as a team which will mirror our Department President's Theme - UNITY BRINGS VICTORY.

- Keep a few details in mind:

 Think about heavyou will use.
- Think about how you will use the photograph (Facebook, website, newspaper, etc.) Print media require images that are larger files/higher resolution.
- Take more pictures than you think you will need; you never know which will turn out best.
- Photos should be clearand sharp.
- $\bullet\,\,$ ·Be aware of surroundings and background frame your picture.
- Make sure everyone's eyes are open no closed eyes.
- ·Avoid angles that include backgrounds with objects that appear to stick out above a person's head.
- Avoid capturing individuals wearing clothing with offensive language.
- · Avoid photographing while people are eating.
- ·Try different angles.
- Ask for advice from others who are good at photography.

- Submit an essay of at least 300 words or less (describing their goals and how this scholarship will allow them to reach their goals) to National Headquarters by February 15, 2026.
- Scholarships are paid directly to the American College, vocational, technical or trade school of the winner's choice.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest

- These 2 is categories is open to high school students in grades 9 12.
- Students enrolled in a public, private, parochial, or home school programs in the United States, its territories, and possessions or dependent of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas school.
- Foreign education student or national winners of previous Young American Patriotic Art Contest are NOT eligible.

There seems to be some confusion about the Outstanding Auxiliary tracking report. So, we want to take this opportunity to go over in detail how it is populated and reported. Population is the critical component; the information comes to Patty and me from several sources, and we compile it into our spreadsheet.

Membership: Pulled directly from Malta a few days before submission to Department for communications. The pull date is noted in top left-hand corner of the report.

Outstanding Auxiliary

Business Requirements

Installation: Report pulled from Malta and provided to OA Chairmen.

Bond: Report pulled from Malta and provided to OA Chairmen.

District Dues: District Treasurers Report on whether Auxiliary's have paid District Dues by 9/30/25. All emails need to be sent to both Maggie and Patty.

Officers Paid Dues: Report pulled from Malta and provided to OA Chairmen.

Donations/Tax Filing/Audits: Listed below are pulled from Department Treasurers Financial Tracker sent out periodically during the month.

- ·VA Medical Donation
- ·H & H Donation
- .990 N
- ·Audits

District Meetings: District Secretaries Reports to OA Chairmen on each Auxiliary attendance at each District meeting. All emails need to be sent to both Maggie and Patty.

District SOI's: District Secretaries Report on District SOI attendance of each Auxiliary President, Secretary and Treasurer to the OA Chairmen. All emails need to be sent to both Maggie and Patty.

Program Requirements

Program Chairman: Submit to Department Secretary by the 15th of each month their tracker form. This is then sent to OA Chairmen Maggie Myers and Patty Baskett for updating the OA tracking.

If Reports are in transit or miss getting logged, they will be on the following months report. If you have sent in your report and do not see it reported within a two-month cycle, reach out the Program Chairman to confirm they have received the report. Always keep a copy of the report for the Auxiliary record until at least you know it is showing reported.

Clarifications:

Tracking standings for any auxiliaries is only done by these resources for consistency. Any emails sent, calls made, text messages sent from members or officers will not be logged with the OA chairmen for any Auxiliary.

Membership sent into Department for processing is not updated on OA report until it is recognized in Malta. For Membership %'s or Officers paid. Left hand corner of the OA report – Dated for when membership is pulled from Malta and when other items are documented through dates. Again, any questions please direct them to the OA Chairmen.

There was a transitional period for the Presidents Special Project and updates were not sent between the two chairmen. It was added to the OA report as a last-minute decision. Chairman will have the reporting updated by the December report.

If an Auxiliary has any concern about accuracy of the OA report, please send their concerns directly to Maggie and Patty and it will be researched asap, and a response will be issued. Corrections will be made based on updates to OA tracker, Chairman's confirmation of receipt of reports or confirmation of corrections to financial tracker. If there is any need for Department President to weigh in, we will reach out to Kelli at the appropriate times.
