Chain of Command/Matters of Concern

Using Proper Channels National By-laws (Yellow Pages; Page 15)

- 1. Those concerns, problems, etc. of an Auxiliary MAY be addressed to the District President who will take their concerns directly to the Department President for consideration. If the concern is in regard to the District President, the Auxiliary may go directly to the Department President.
- 2. The Department President then decides who should be assigned to handle the concerns of that particular Auxiliary.
- 3. If the concern warrants it, the Department President may address it to the National President for their consideration.

4. It is the practice of National Headquarters that a Department President have the first opportunity to assist Auxiliaries and members of their department. Therefore, any correspondence received from an individual, Auxiliary or District will be referred to the Department President so that they have the first opportunity to assist or fulfill a request.

The Department Officers and I are available to help each Auxiliary thrive. Please feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns.

Bylaws in our podium book require them to maintain a record of all Patriotic days and initiate programs for proper observance. Discussions about Americanism in our meetings will give Patriotic Instructors the chance to teach the values and traditions of the Auxiliary.

Your Auxiliary should be aware of upcoming community and civic events in your area that you can partner with and assist another organization in their event that is *open to the public*.

Outreach is the process of an organization building relationships with people; the act of extending services, benefits, etc., to a wider section of the population, as in community work

I reached out to the National Ambassador for Auxiliary Outreach regarding some of the reports I have received. **PLEASE read her response to some concerns.** I hope this addresses some of the questions I have had regarding your partnering with other organizations.

".... if they serve on a committee with the [organization], part of their job would be to work their events. Same goes for helping in your own church. Now if the church were having an event open to the public and needed volunteers to work on the event members of the Auxiliary could do that for Auxiliary Outreach. But just volunteering your time within your own church does not count.

Members want this to be Community Service, and it is not. We (the Auxiliary) are partnering with another organization to help make their event successful, it is all about the Outreach."

Some examples:

- Members of a local Auxiliary were asked to sit on their county board to help raise money and volunteer to work at a dedication of a memorial that honors veterans. This is not Auxiliary Outreach (you are a part of the organization, Americanism)
- Our Auxiliary purchases and delivers turkeys for a food pantry every Thanksgiving.
 This is not Auxiliary Outreach
 Auxiliary members volunteer at the local food pantry to help pass out Thanksgiving turkeys to the public. This is Auxiliary Outreach
- Auxiliary participates in a walk in our area that raises awareness about suicide prevention.
 Members walk in the event and donate \$100 to the organization. This is not Auxiliary Outreach
 The Auxiliary members choose to help with registration for the event and hand out water to the participants. This is Auxiliary Outreach

*** I have received a lot of reports that should be reported in Americanism, Veterans & Family Services, Hospital, or Youth Activities. Auxiliary Outreach reports should not fall into any other Auxiliary program.

The National Ambassador's Theme is - "You Can't Stop the Waves But You Can Learn to Surf." This year we will understand how this theme corresponds to the goals of the Extension and Revitalization Program.

WHAT IS THE MEANING OF EXTENSION

One definition of Extension is "an enlargement in scope or operation."

Another definition is

– "An additional
period of time
given to meet an
obligation."

How do these two definitions relate to our mission as an Auxiliary?

It means that we need to grow in our Auxiliaries, grow in our membership, and grow in the scope of our National Programs.

This coming year, we will concentrate on how to increase the number of Auxiliaries in this Department. The VFW Department of Virginia has 122 Posts, and the VFW Department Auxiliary has 65 Auxiliaries.

As such, there are 57 "Unaffiliated Posts" that we can reach out to and explain the benefits of having an Auxiliary.

Please note that we <u>no longer</u> use the term "Bachelor Post."
 Instead, the correct verbiage is "Unaffiliated Post."

Why the change? Because there are many women in the VFW. As such, the term bachelor is no longer a good description of a VFW Post without an Auxiliary. In fact, the first female, Carol Whitmore was just elected as the new VFW National Commander-in-Chief.

NOW THE CHALLENGE

• Now comes the challenge of how to effectively reach out to such a large number of "Unaffiliated Posts" in Virginia?

One avenue would be to insert an Extension letter in the VFW Department's General Orders. However, such request would need approval. Thanks to Department President Levitt who reached out to the Department Commander, I am pleased that permission has been granted to print such a letter monthly in the General Orders.

UNITY BRINGS VICTORY

The Department President's Theme is "Unity Brings Victory" - so approval to print this letter certainly proves that "Unity Brings Victory" between our two Department leaders, Doug Hoffman and Kelli Levitt.

Are local people involved? (yes or no)

Is the event happening in the near future - within the next month? (yes or no)

Will non-members be interested in attending or hearing about the event? (yes or no)

Will the event help the local community?

(yes or no) If yes, how? (describe)

Is the activity or event unique? (yes or no)

Does the activity or event promote a new idea or concept? (yes or no)

Members and youth who are participating in a "Buddy" ® Poppy Drive

or POW/MIA remembrance ceremony.

Scholarship winners such as the winner of the Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest Flag presentations to community groups.

Publicizing what your Auxiliary has done to help natural disaster victims.

National President's Visit.

Repairs on a Veteran's Home/Building a Wheelchair Ramp/etc.

Walks/Runs/Events to raise awareness/funds for Veteran Issues/PTSD.

What's NOT Newsworthy?

Your meetings.

Who was elected to various positions in vour Local Auxiliary.

When you are having a spaghetti dinner, Bingo nights, etc.

These are all good Calendar of Events, Local Tidbit items. etc.

NOT Feature Stories.

What is Newsworthy?

Events hosted by an Auxiliary at a VA facility.

Decorating graves for Veterans Day and Memorial Day; participating in Wreaths Across America.

Assisting families of deployed troops (Hosting holiday events, i.e., Christmas parties, Easter Egg hunts, Trick-or-Treat events, offering financial assistance, etc.)

Adopting a Unit through the VFW's Veteran and Military Support Program.

Collecting supplies for deployed troops. Meeting troops at the airport as they return from deployment and helping them complete their journey home.

Something to Note

While we encourage you to share events/ activities that are hosted jointly with the VFW, we are really interested in what your Auxiliary is doing in your community!

While our mission is to support veterans, activeduty military and their families, we are two separate organizations.

Continuing Education Scholarship

This Auxiliary scholarship is for members and their immediate family (who have been a member for at least 1 year) with financial needs.

- The applicant must be at least 21 years of age by February 15, 2026, and answer ALL the questions on the application.
- Submit an essay of at least 300 words or less (describing their goals and how this scholarship will allow them to reach their goals) to National Headquarters by February 15, 2026.
- The Scholarships are paid directly to the American College, vocational, technical or trade school of the winner's choice.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest

3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest

- These two categories are open to high school students in grades 9 12.
- Students enrolled in a public, private, parochial, or home school programs in the United States, its territories and possessions or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in an overseas school.
- Foreign education students or national winners of previous Young American Patriotic Art Contest are NOT eligible.

Suicide Prevention and Opioid Addiction Services in Virginia

The Suicide Prevention and Opioid Addiction Services (SOS) Program is a part of the Virginia Veteran and Family Support (VVFS) services. 

Register records and preserves the history of the powerful women who have defended this country-both past and present.

From the earliest days of the nation, women have been serving alongside men to gain and preserve liberty, but it was difficult to find them in our history books. There was no repository of women's service to the United States. That all changed in April 1987.

Not long after legislation authorized the Women In Military Service For America Memorial and ten years before the Memorial would open to the public in 1997, the *Register* was created. Servicewomen and women veterans were invited to make their military experiences visible by "registering" their service. By completing a simple form with their dates of service, branch of service, awards and decorations, at least one memorable experience, and a picture in uniform, women took their rightful and visible place in history for all time. For the first time in American history, there was a place to learn about the extraordinary servicewomen who defend or have defended our country.

For more than 30 years, the Memorial has been permanently documenting military women's experiences and their impact on American, military and women's history. Visitors are invited to look up servicewomen in the *Register*, learn about their impact on our collective history, and purchase a print of individual profiles as a keepsake.
