Bond: I am so happy to say that all Auxiliaries have paid their bond before the deadline of August 31st!! **Thank you, everyone!!**

Sec. 801—Eligibility for an Elected Officers: Any member in good standing belonging to an Auxiliary shall be eligible to any office in the Auxiliary, County Council, District, Department, or the National Organization.

Reminders: if the President, Treasurer or Secretary of your District or Auxiliary is an annual member, their annual dues must be paid no later than December 31, 2023. As per National if dues are not paid by the President, Treasurer or Secretary by January 4, 2024, the Department must submit an e-mail or letter on January 5, 2023, requesting the non-paid Officer be relieved of their position.

To all the Auxiliary members in the Department of Virginia, Please the **CHAIN OF COMMAND** first is your Auxiliary President, if they cannot help you with the issue contact your District President if they do not have the answer, please contact the Department President or a Department Line Officer. Never call National before following this Chain of Command. If it is necessary, the Department will contact them to get guidance/clarity.

STAY INFORMED ABOUT CHANGES: Podium Book Available Now! Good news!! The 2024 Podium Book: Bylaws and Ritual is available NOW in MALTA under Member Resources! The Bylaws underwent a number of changes this year, perhaps the biggest of which is the change of the bullet system. The large/small bullets have been changed to an alphanumeric system. This was suggested and voted on by delegates at the 2023 National Convention during the discussion of Bylaws and Resolutions. Other voted-upon changes include "Conductress" becoming "Conductor" and the removal of County Councils (decided by the VFW in 2022). Check it out now! Note: a hard copy will be available for purchase soon from the VFW Store.

Sec. 712A—Auxiliary Secretary

- The Auxiliary Secretary shall
- Maintain a roll of deceased members with the date of death. At National Convention it was voted that the secretary no longer had to maintain a roll of deceased members with date of death.
- Input or transmit the names of the Delegates and Alternates to Secretaries required to receive them within thirty (30) calendar days of election.
- Immediately following installation, enter the required information into MALTA or submit the installation report to the Department Secretary within seven (7) calendar days.

Sec. 717—Conductor Duties of

- The Conductor shall assist the President and perform such duties as the Ritual may prescribe.
- Shall arrange the room and put away paraphernalia at the close of the meeting. At National Convention it was voted that the conductress will now be known at CONDUCTOR.

The membership numbers on the Membership and Financial Tracker are pulled from the National website under Reports and the Daily Comprehensive Membership Report which includes an as of midnight date. I am using the Total Number to reflect your actual number of members. For the purposes of the banner, the membership chairman will use the Peak Total number as this includes deaths and transfers.



Remember to contact your membership for dues renewals. Beginning next July 1, 2024, <u>the amount to send for an annual membership will be \$16.00</u>. National voted to raise the per capita dues by \$5.00. The Department voted to raise the per capita dues by \$.50. Now is the time for the Auxiliaries to look at their dues and decide if they need to raise them.

Membership Applications must be checked **for completeness**. Some are coming in with missing birthdates. The application cannot be processed without a birthdate. Also, when paying by credit card for a life member, all of the requested information must be present including the amount to be charged. If it is wrong or missing, the application cannot be processed until the missing information is provided.



Don't forget to file your 990-N with the IRS prior to November 15, 2023, or you can lose your non-profit status. If you would like me to file it for you, fill out the request form included in the forms packet available on the Department website. Please include the name and address of the Treasurer as they are the Responsible party. https://vfwauxva.org/uploads/Documents/2024990form.pdf





The 2nd Quarter Audit was due by August 31, 2023.



September 30, 2023, is the *deadline* for paying your District Dues. Check with your District Treasurer for the required amount.

Extension and Revitalization



We are starting a new Program Year. Let's make sure Auxiliaries get started on the right track. There are many things that a Department Chief of Staff, District Presidents, or District Mentor can look for to help Auxiliaries become a healthy Auxiliary.

We need to **push for each Auxiliary to have ten (10) meetings a year. I** know that in the winter it is hard, but we need to try. If a quorum is not present refer to National Bylaws, Section 210 – Meetings, Regular and Special, 5th bullet: Video conferencing or teleconferencing when used to form a full quorum shall be utilized for extenuating circumstances to meet the required minimal ten meeting dates; or a member vote that needs immediate attention.

Is there good attendance at the Auxiliary meeting? Are you making the meeting productive and short? Follow an agenda to keep the meeting on track. Is the meeting day and time appropriate for members to attend? Send out a survey to see when members would like to have a meeting and what to do for the National Programs.



Are the Officers, Chairman and members having good conversation at their meeting or is it just one person? Every member has a voice. Please listen to all. If a member comes up with something new, try it! It might be something great this time around.

The Auxiliary election of Officers has been held. Are the elected Officers the same members who have been there before or is it someone new? You can have your Mentoring for Leadership Chairman mentor the members with new ideas or help the new members understand what the National Auxiliary Bylaws say. Sometimes you just need a mentor to help the Auxiliaries look at it differently.

The below could be a **<u>Red Flag</u>**. We need to watch for the little things to help our Auxiliaries, then we can help them grow stronger to **become healthy Auxiliaries**.

Are the Trustees completing the Auxiliary audits on time? If the answer is no, we can send in a team to help with the audits or explain why they are required every three (3) months. District Presidents, check with our Department Treasurer on who is falling behind.

<u>District Presidents</u>: Did your District or the Auxiliaries get their Bonds purchased, Paid District dues by 9/30/2023 and filed the 990N by 11-15-2023? *If not*, call your Department Treasurer to help contact these Auxiliaries and the District. Use a team to work with both Auxiliaries and Districts.

<u>District Presidents</u>: Are the Auxiliary, District Officers' membership dues being paid by December 31? Again, you can ask your Department Treasurer to provide a list for you. Then, working with your Department Membership Chairman, start making phone calls.

Then, we always need to watch membership, new and retention, in the Auxiliaries. Talk with your Membership Chairman to see if you can work together. As a team we can help these Auxiliaries become stronger, healthy Auxiliaries. Membership growth will come with more members involved in our Auxiliary, District and Department.



As **Department Chief of Staff**, I would like to use a team to work with our Districts and Auxiliaries. Do not do the job alone. Department Chairmen are key team members – membership will slide into their Programs. There is always someone to team up with to make your Department, District and Auxiliary stronger. **Would you like to become a team member?**

The focus this month is: Community Care:

Please visit: va.gov/community care. Veterans may be eligible for care through a provider in their local community, depending on their health care needs or circumstances, and if they meet specific eligibility criteria. Even if a veteran is eligible for community care, they generally still have the option to receive care from a VA medical facility. In most cases, veterans must receive approval from VA before receiving care from a community provider to avoid being billed for the care. VA staff members generally make all eligibility determinations for community care. Through the community care system, the veteran can utilize an innetwork physician under the following systems or circumstances:

- General Community Care
- Urgent Care
- Emergency Care
- Foreign Medical Care
- Home Health & Hospice Care
- Indian/Tribal Health Services
- In Vitro Fertilization
- State Veterans Homes
- COVID & Flu Shots



The VA Community Care Network is a connection for veterans to access community providers that will assist with timely and high-quality care.

LEGISLATIVE

Elections will be held on November 7 for General and Special Elections It is important that you be *INVOLVED in the ELECTION PROCESS*.

POLITICAL INVOLVEMENT

Early Voting begins Friday, Sept. 22 Deadline to Register or Update Registration is October 16 Deadline for a Ballot to be Mailed to you is October 27

- It is important to remember that in all Auxiliary political activities, we *must remain neutral*. You can host a forum for all political candidates, but you cannot endorse any one candidate. If asked to endorse a political candidate, explain that the VFW Auxiliary prohibits such an endorsement. Do not allow your VFW Auxiliary to appear to support or endorse an individual candidate.
- Host or attend town hall meetings. Encourage your members to attend with you and to participate.
- Develop intelligent questions for candidates during election campaigns or during discussion of legislative issues, to address the issues our membership supports.
- The Auxiliary is prohibited from directly or indirectly participating in, or intervening in, or contributing to any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for elective public office.
- The Auxiliary should conduct voter education activities (including presenting public forums and publishing voter education guides) in a non-partisan manner. Encourage people to participate in the electoral process, such as voter registration and get-out-the-vote drives, would not be prohibited political campaign activity if conducted in a non-partisan manner.

Voter information: Be sure to check out your candidate's websites for information for their stance on Veteran's issues. Report those members that work the polls, transport voters to the polls, etc.

• Virginia law requires all voters to provide either an acceptable form of ID or sign an ID Confirmation Statement at the polls. https://www.elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot/in-person-voting/

Sec. 810A—Auxiliary President. [8th Bullett, page 74]

The Auxiliary President shall appoint a committee of not less than five (5) members, including the Treasurer, to contact all members during the year for payment of dues. • It is recommended that they also contact those who have not paid dues for the preceding years.

- This Committee shall report on all contacts made and turn any money collected over to the Treasurer as soon as possible,
 - o No later than the first meeting following collection.
 - Volunteers may also be used.

PRESIDENT'S SPECIAL PROJECT

Protect our Defenders is a nonprofit organization working to end sexual violence, victim retaliation, misogyny, sexual prejudice, and racism in the U.S. military.



Not all scars show, not all wounds heal. Sometimes it's just not visible, the pain that someone feels. Mission: Protect Our Defenders (POD) is the pre-eminent national human rights organization dedicated to ending sexual violence, victim retaliation, misogyny, sexual prejudice, and racism in the military and combating a culture that has allowed it to persist. We honor, support, and give voice to survivors of military sexual violence. We seek reform to ensure all service members are provided a safe and respectful work environment free from misogyny and racism, and have access to a fair, impartially administered system of justice.



Values: The women and men who serve in our Armed Forces should not have to work in an environment where harassment and sexual assault is widespread and victims face retribution for reporting their assaults. Service members deserve a system of justice worthy of the American principles they have dedicated their lives to protect. The prevalence of sexual violence, victim retaliation, misogyny and racism in the military and a culture that has allowed it to persist erode military values of integrity and sacrifice, undermine good order and discipline and exacerbate existing inequalities for women, people of color and LGBTQ service members. Reforming this culture will strengthen our military and promote unit cohesion and morale. Protect Our Defenders has a deep

understanding of military process and procedure. We work respectfully and collaboratively, engaging stakeholders who can speak from personal experience about the need for reform, to promote change from outside and from within the military.

Our Work: Protect Our Defenders deploys a multifaceted effort towards reform. Every day, through policy reform, advocacy, public education, and pro bono support, we work to provide those who serve in our military a safe and respectful environment free from harassment and abuse, and to create a justice system that can fairly and effectively adjudicate these crimes. These efforts are directly informed by our work with survivors, their families, and current and former military members, and are grounded in our core values.

Policy Reform & Legal Advocacy: We engage in a multifaceted effort to change the culture of sexual abuse and harassment, empower victims, and create a fair and impartial system of justice for our service members that is transparent and accountable. We do this through policy advocacy, legal challenges in military courts, reports exposing systemic abuse, and by filing amicus briefs to protect the rights of survivors and enforce their rights.

Legal & Case Assistance: POD's Legal Services Program is the only program in the country providing free legal services specifically for survivors of military sexual assault and sexual harassment, and bystanders and whistleblowers who are suffering retaliation for intervening or reporting sexual assault or harassment. Services often include victim legal representation for the military justice process, protection from retaliation, discharge records corrections, and assistance with obtaining needed health care.

Research & Analysis: Members of Congress, stakeholders, survivors, advocates and the press rely on POD for fact-based analysis. We analyze and translate prevalence reports and research on sexual assault and harassment, synthesize the results into fact sheets, press for collection and disclosure of military data on demographics of and disparities affecting both the victim and the accused, educate the public and press on key findings, and collaborate on major research projects.


Education, Advocacy & Movement Building: POD supports survivors in their efforts to speak with the press, their members of Congress, and at local events across the country. We work with an ever-growing community of survivors, families, and civilian advocates to develop and disseminate calls to action and materials that educate and engage the civilian and military communities about the need for reform.

Media Engagement: POD works with the media to provide expert analysis and break investigative reports. We dive deep into cases to expose misconduct and abuse within the military and push to keep the issue of assault and harassment in the military at the forefront of public debate.

Veterans & Family Support

This month the focus is on Veteran & Military Support Programs. The VFW's Veteran & Military Support Programs serve active-duty and recently discharged members of the military. They are:

• VFW's "Sport Clips Help A Hero Scholarship" provides service members and veterans, who are U.S. Citizens, with scholarships of up to \$5,000 to complete their educational goals without incurring excessive student load debt. It's another way for the VFW to say "thank you" to those who fought for our freedoms.

Applicants must be retired, honorably discharged, active duty, or a member of the National Guard or Reserve. The applicant must be separated with or currently hold a military rank of E-5 or below and demonstrate a need for financial assistance. The applicant must participate in, be accepted to or currently enrolled in a VA-approved program or school at an accredited post-secondary institution.



Scholarships are limited to one per family per semester.

Applications for the fall semester will be accepted January 1 through April 30; Spring semester will be accepted August 1 through November 15th. Fall semester scholarships will be awarded in August and spring semester scholarships will be awarded in January. Scholarships must be used by the end of the school semester for which the veteran is applying, or they will become null and void. Scholarships are restricted for tuition and fees only and will be paid directly to accredited schools. See https://vfw.org/assistance/student-veterans-support for more information.

• <u>Student Veteran Support Grant</u> offers much needed assistance to support specific student veteran events. The grant, administered by the VFW Washington Office, focuses on supporting the overall student veteran population within the community, which consists of many student veterans at campuses across the country that are not affiliated with an SVA chapter. The grants will be disbursed to a VFW Post or Department that has submitted an application, to support the student veterans at the university or college.

Grant Eligibility: 1. Applicants must be VFW members associated with an appropriate entity of the VFW (VFW Post, District, Department, or National); 2. Appropriate VFW Post, District, Department, or National leadership serve as the convening authority on the grant request and is responsible for receiving funds; 3. Funds must be utilized for events and outreach designed to assist and support veterans currently enrolled in institutions of higher learning; 4. Grants may be awarded up to \$500 to support each event, and grants can be awarded to a VFW entity twice each fiscal year, totaling up to \$1,000.

• <u>VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship</u> grants exemplary student veterans (Fellows) the chance to join the VFW legislative team on Capitol Hill during the VFW Legislative Conference



hosted in early spring each year. The Fellows will walk the halls of Congress, educating their legislators on the issues facing today's student veterans and have the opportunity to meet with policymakers from federal agencies responsible for implementing veterans' policy. - <u>Unmet Needs</u> is there to help America's service members who have run into unexpected financial difficulties. The program provides financial aid of up to \$1,500 to assist with basic life needs in the form of a grant not a loan so no repayment is required. To further ease the burden, the creditor is paid directly. The financial hardship must be due to one of the following: https://webportalapp.com/sp/login/vfw unmetneeds
 - Currently on active duty, whose financial hardship is a result of a current deployment, military pay error, or from being discharged for medical reasons.
 - Discharged on or after September 11, 2001, whose financial hardship is a direct result of your military service-connected injuries and/or illnesses.
 - Discharged prior to September 11, 2001, are on a fixed income that must include VA compensation for a service-connected injury/illness and facing an unexpected financial hardship.



Think of the Military Assistance Program (MAP) as the VFW's troop support. Since 2005, MAP has helped provide financial assistance to VFW Post and Auxiliaries to sponsor troop send-offs, homecomings and get-togethers. Posts and Auxiliaries participating in Adopt-A-Unit and Family Readiness Groups can also receive assistance. 

What is the Voice of Democracy Program?

Since 1947, the Voice of Democracy has been the Veterans of Foreign Wars' (VFW's) premier scholarship program. Each year, nearly 27,000 high school students compete for more than \$2 million in scholarships and incentives. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's theme is, "What are the greatest attributes of our Democracy?"

Why Should I Enter?

Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, state and national level. Department (State) winners receive an all-expense-paid trip to Washington DC, to tour the city, be honored by the VFW and its Auxiliary and receive their portion of \$171,000 in national awards, the top scholarship being \$35,000.

The Rules

Who can enter?

The Voice of Democracy is open to students in grades 9-12 by the Oct. 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign exchange students, students age 20 or over, previous Voice of Democracy first place state winners, GED or Adult Education Students are ineligible.

What do I need to enter?

Record your original 3-5 minute (+ or – 5 second max.) audio essay on a flash drive, or other electronic device. You will submit the recording, typed essay and this completed entry form. Provide these items to your school/group competition or VFW Post for judging. In addition you can submit your emailed entry form, essay, and audio file to the VFW Post upon approval. You must be the sole author of your essay. The recording must be in your own voice and in English. Hearing/speech impaired students should email the Voice of Democracy National Office at **youthscholarships@vfw.org** for special instructions. No music, singing, poetry or sound effects are allowed. The body of the essay must not identify you in any way, (including, but not limited to your name, school, city, state, race, or national origin) although the recording & typed essay should be labeled with your name, to show ownership.

Where Do I Submit My Entry?

All entries begin at the VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post. Entries sent to VFW National will be returned. One winner for every 15 entries from each Post advances to District and one District winner advances to the state (Department) competition. If you need help finding a participating VFW Post, follow these instructions: First, visit this website **vfw.org/FindaPost** to "Find A VFW Post." If you do not have success in finding a Post, or if you have trouble getting in touch with them, you can contact your VFW Department (state) office to see if they can offer any information or assistance. Patriotic Written Essay Competition Grand Prize: \$5,000 Award

What is the Patriot's Pen Program?

Conducted nationwide, this VFW-sponsored youth essay competition gives students an opportunity to write essays expressing their views on an annual patriotic theme. We invite you to join the more than 73,000 students who participated last year in this contest.

Why Should I Enter?

Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, State and national level. Department (State) winners receive a portion of \$55,000 in national awards. National Winners will receive at least \$500. The first-place national award is currently \$5,000.

The Internal Revenue Service requires a recipient awarded more than \$599 be given Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable income. This may require the winner to provide their social security number.

How Does the Contest Work?

All entries begin at the VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post.

The contest consists of four levels. The first level (entry) is sponsored by VFW Posts. Post winners advance, one for every 15 entries, to the VFW District (regional) level where the one first-place winner is advanced to the VFW Department (state) level. The first-place winner at the Department level is then advanced into the VFW national competition.

Who Can Enter?

Patriot's Pen is open to 6th, 7th and 8th-grade students enrolled by the Oct. 31 deadline in public, private or parochial schools in the U.S., its territories or its possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Home-schooled students also are eligible. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. (Foreign exchange students or former winners that placed in the National contest are ineligible.)

How Do I Get Started?

- Ask a teacher or youth group/club adult leader to supervise the Patriot's Pen writing contest.
- Contact a participating VFW Post and indicate your interest in participating.

- Establish a contact person who is a member of that VFW Post or its VFW Auxiliary.
- Make sure that your essay is submitted to the VFW Post before the contest deadline of October 31, 2023. You can submit your essay and entry form by email upon the Post's approval. Entries sent to the VFW National Headquarters directly will be returned.

How Am I Judged?

Knowledge of the theme is worth 30 points:

You must show a thorough knowledge of the theme in your work. Demonstrate you have researched the issue extensively.

Theme development is worth 35 points:

Answer all relevant facts about the theme such as the who, what, where, when and why. Relate the theme to your own experiences.

Clarity of ideas is worth 35 points:

Write your essay in an easy-to-understand format. Leave your reader with a clear understanding of your explanation of the theme.

What Is the Theme?

VFW's Commander-in-Chief annually chooses the year's theme. The 2023-2024 theme is:

"How are you inspired by America?"

Deadline Information.

To qualify, all entries must be submitted to a sponsoring VFW Post by midnight October 31, 2023.


