What Is It? The VFW National Home is currently in the process of renovating the Health & Education Building, with focus on the offices downstairs where the Veterans Resource Center opened in October, 2022. The Veterans Resource Center helps veterans and their families access resources and support they otherwise may not be able to find or afford. Note: When this Auxiliary-sponsored building opened nearly a century ago, it was the campus hospital. For a while, it even housed quarantined children with tuberculosis.

How Much? The National Home needs an estimated \$10,000 to complete this project. (Any excess will go toward additional Veterans Resource Center necessities.)

How Can We Help? There are nearly 3,500 Auxiliaries. If each Auxiliary were to donate \$3 in December, the National Home could finish 2022 having already met their goal! Legislative

It is our duty to educate our communities and young civic organization members the importance of standing up to protect their rights and benefits. House Floor Consideration

Consideration of a measure by the full House can be a simple or very complex operation. In general, a measure is ready for consideration by the full House after it has been reported by a committee. Under certain circumstances, it may be brought to the Floor directly.

The consideration of a measure may be governed by a "rule". A rule is itself a simple resolution, which must be passed by the House, that sets out the particulars of debate for a specific bill—how much time will be allowed for debate, whether amendments can be offered, and other matters.

Debate time for a measure is normally divided between proponents and opponents. Each side yields time to those members who wish to speak on the bill. When amendments are offered, these are also debated and voted upon. If the House is in session today, you can see a summary of Current House Floor Proceedings.

After all debate is concluded and amendments decided upon, the House is ready to vote on final passage. In some cases, a vote to "recommit" the bill to committee is requested. This is usually an effort by opponents to change some portion or table the measure. If the attempt to recommit fails, a vote on final passage is ordered.

Votes on final passage, as well as all other votes in the House, may be taken by the electronic voting system which registers each individual member's response. These votes are referred to as Yea/Nay votes or recorded votes, and are available in House Votes by bill number, roll call vote number or words describing the reason for the vote.

Votes in the House may also be by voice vote, and no record of individual responses is available.

NATIONAL BY-LAW REQUIREMENTS:

- Auxiliary installation report must be received by National Headquarters by June 30, 2022.\This can be entered through MALTA. If you enter through MALTA, please provide the information to the Department Secretary. If unable to do through MALTA, please send to the Department Secretary by June15, 2022 for submission. If the installation report is not received by the National Headquarter by June 30, 2022, the report must be mailed to the National Headquarters for input. If not received at the National Headquarters by July 31, 2022, the Department MUST submit request for suspension to allow time to mentor and rejuvenate. Sec 806A Auxiliary. TIP: Do not wait until June. Installation Report can be submitted following the Installation.
- Auxiliary President and Treasurer must be bonded by August 31, 2022. The bond can be paid by the Treasurer through MALTA. If you wish to mail a check, the bond application is available on MALTA. If not paid by August 31, 2021, the Department they MUST submit for suspension by that date to allow time to mentor and rejuvenate the Auxiliary. Sec 814-Trustee, page 89 TIP: Do not wait until the last minute. Bond can be paid any time after July 1st.
- District dues must be remitted to the <u>District Treasurer</u> by September 30, 2022 as per National Bylaws Section 506. Amount due is based on the Auxiliary membership as of June 30, 2022 at the amount established by the District Standing Rules. Sec 506 District.

If the President, Treasurer or Secretary are an annual member, their annual dues must be paid no later than December 31, 2022. As per National If dues are not paid by the President, Treasurer or Secretary by January 4, 2023, the Department must submit an e-mail or letter on January 5, 2022 requesting the non-paid Officer be relieved of their position. FYI.....Any annual member who does not pay their dues by December 31, 2022 are no longer a member in good standing. Be sure to check those membership cards at your January meeting.

TRAINING:

Auxiliary President, Secretary and/or Treasurer must attend either the Department School of Instruction OR District School of Instruction either in person or if the School of Instructions are available virtual. In person Schools will be dependent on Covid restrictions established by the Commonwealth of Virginia. FYI - Although the President, Secretary and/or Treasurer are required to attend one of the SOI, the Schools are open to all members.

SECTION 810A ATTENDANCE:

Assure that the President or their Representative attend all properly called District Convention or Meetings. The District Secretary to report to OA Chairman immediately after SOI's and District with a list of names, title, and Auxiliary number of those who attended. Trustees are encouraged to attend the Department and District School. If meetings are available on a virtual setting, an Auxiliary Member Representative must call in or join virtually staying for the entire meeting to count towards attendance.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

My Ambassador, Renee Fulk, posted this for January and I am copying it verbatim. Its important information so please read and respond to me so I can let her know Virginia is on top of this.

"In this promotion, I want to focus on a couple of things: VFW National Veterans Service (NVS) and the situation with Camp Lejeune.

National Veterans Service (NVS): In my opinion, the VFW NVS program is one of the most critical services the VFW provides to veterans, service members transitioning to civilian life and their families.

These accredited professionals assist veterans through the complicated process of filing claims for benefits for service-connected injuries and disabilities, which is the mechanism that allows the VA to provide compensation for those injuries and disabilities. They see the veteran through the entire process even if the claim is denied and an appeal needs to be filed.

I have a few challenges to offer: 1) Please let your Department Veterans & Family Support Chairman know that you can identify where in your community or state a VFW Accredited Service Officer works. 2) Please let your Department Veterans & Family Support Chairman know how your Auxiliary supports those VFW Accredited Service Officers. 3) Department Veterans & Family Support Chairmen, let me know the results.

Camp Lejeune: The following is an article from the VFW website at: vfw.org/advocacy/pact-act-and-toxic-exposure-information Also visit: https://vfw.org/camplejeunehelp

For more than three decades, service members, military families and civilians living and working at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, were exposed to toxic drinking water which has been linked to life-long health effects. The below information has been gathered to assist exposed veterans and their families.

VA Benefits: According to the VA, they provide health care and compensation benefits for veterans who served at least 30 days of service at Camp Lejeune or Marine Corps Air Station New River, North Carolina, from Aug. 1953 to Dec. 1987, and suffer from certain health conditions, including: kidney cancer, liver cancer, Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, adult leukemia, multiple myeloma, Parkinson's disease, bladder cancer, aplastic anemia and other myelodysplastic syndromes. Family members who lived at Camp Lejeune or Marine Corps Air Station New River from Aug. 1953 to Dec. 1987 may be eligible for reimbursement of out-of-pocket medical expenses for health care related to any of the following conditions: bladder cancer, breast cancer, esophageal cancer, female infertility, hepatic steatosis, kidney cancer, leukemia, lung cancer, miscarriage, multiple myeloma, myelodysplastic syndromes, neurobehavioral effects, Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, renal toxicity and scleroderma. The VFW's worldwide network of accredited service officers are trained and available to assist veterans and family members with Camp Lejeune-related VA benefits.

Find a Service Officer: If you've already met with a VFW Accredited Service Officer and determined pursuing a Camp Lejeune lawsuit is right for you, contact a VFW-entrusted law firm today. Our responsibility is to make sure all who are affected are informed with accurate information. It is also important to recommend the VFW-entrusted law firm that has been vetted and ready to assist the needs of those affected."



RULES

Displays will be presented and judged in three categories:

- CATEGORY 1. <u>Public Promotion of Poppy Campaign</u> (Window, booth, parade, poster displays, campaign promotions, etc.)
 - (a) Displays must be designed for public exposure and must bear a message soliciting a donation for and wearing of the VFW "Buddy" Poppy.
 - (b) At least one (1) of the Poppies used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached.
- **CATEGORY 2.** <u>Memorial or Inspirational Displays</u> (Wreaths, memorial tablets or plaques, patriotic or devotional themes)
 - (a) Displays must be designed to honor the dead, to inspire devotion to God and Country, or to dramatize the activities supported by the "Buddy" Poppy.
 - (b) At least one (1) of the Poppies used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached.
- CATEGORY 3. <u>Artistic or Decorative Use of Poppies</u> (Post Home displays, table centerpieces, corsages, pictures, plaques, models, scenes, hats, novelty pieces, etc.)
 - (a) Any display not meeting the qualifications for Categories 1 or 2 shall automatically be entered in Category 3.
 - (b) At least one (1) of the Poppies used in the display must be in its original form and color, with label attached.
- (1) Displays shall be set up in space provided in the convention facility by 8:00 a.m. on Saturday. Prior to setting up the display, the responsible person <u>must register</u> with the Buddy Poppy/National Home Chairman by completing an entry form which will be sent to the Chairman **no later than**May 25, 2023 which will show the category of competition, the number of Poppies used, the purpose of the display, the Post and/or Auxiliary number and location, and the name of the person who will dismantle and remove the display at the close of the convention. (Please be advised, <u>all</u>

 <u>displays must be removed BETWEEN 12:00 p. m. but NO LATER THAN 4:00 p.m.</u>

 on SATURDAY, June 3, 2023 or it will be disposed of.)
- (2) Displays <u>may or may not</u> be accompanied by a white card, not to exceed 4 inches by 6 inches in size, on which is lettered in black ink an explanation of the theme for the display or other information of interest to the viewers or the judges.
- (3) Post name, number, city or state (including the shape of your state) may **not** be visible on the displays. Failure to comply will result in disqualification.

JUDGING

Judging of displays will be on the basis of effectiveness, purpose, clarity of theme, suitability, originality, beauty and number of Poppies used. Where a sample of a large number of identical items (such as corsages or wreaths) is entered, full credit shall be given for the total number of Poppies used. Judging will be completed by 11:30 a. m. on Saturday and the winning displays will have the appropriate ribbons placed on the display and will be announced during the Convention.

Sec. 801 – Eligibility

- Any member in good standing shall be eligible to any office in the Auxiliary, County Council, District, Department, or the National Organization in which they are a member.
- No member shall hold two (2) elective offices on the same level at the same time.
- The member may hold one (1) elective and one (1) or more appointive offices on that level.
- The exception to this rule being that a Trustee may hold another elective or appointive office other than President, Secretary, or Treasurer.
- Officers, elective or appointive, may hold office in a higher or lower body and such offices may be held concurrently, (i.e., a District President could be elected as a Department Officer. This is not holding two (2) elective offices on the same level.)
- Any member who has been removed from office in accordance with Section 809B shall not be eligible for election to that office during the current Auxiliary year.

<u>SEC. 802 – ELECTIVE OFFICERS</u>. *Department elective officers* shall include the *District Presidents* as elected by the districts.
