STATE PRESIDENT



- ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS: Please remember the Object of our organization: The objects of this
 organization shall be fraternal, patriotic, historical, charitable and educational; to assist the Posts and
 members thereof of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, and its own members whenever
 possible; to maintain true allegiance to the Government of the United States of America and fidelity to its
 Constitution and Laws; to foster true patriotism; to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom
 and equal rights and justice to all men and women; and to preserve and defend the United States of
 America from all her enemies.
- ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS: As of November 22, 2019, the Department's membership was 87.54%. While your efforts to retain, recruit and reinstate are working, we need to exert even more effort to involve more members in recruiting more new members, reinstating members, and striving to reach the goal of 100% by December 31st. If you would like assistance in recruiting, please let me know. The Line Officers are here to help. I would like to bring to your attention the following Awards for Membership: AWARDS FOR AUXILIARIES: 50/50 Award \$50 to each Auxiliary that reaches 95% by November 30, 2019, and \$50 to each Auxiliary that reaches 100% Plus by January 31, 2020, based on the June 30, 2019, total membership numbers.
 - Department Award #1 for 95%+ membership by 11/30/19 = \$500
 - Department Award #2 for 100% Plus membership by 1/31/20 = \$500.
 - The Department will also be reimbursed the cost of the banquet ticket at the 2020 Mid-Year Conference for the Department for reaching 100+ in Membership.
- SEC. 810A--AUXILIARY PRESIDENTS: The Auxiliary President "shall appoint a committee of not less than five (5) members, including the Treasurer, to contact all members during the year for payment of dues. They shall also contact those who have not paid dues for the preceding years. This committee shall report on all contacts made and turn any money collected over to the Treasurer as soon as possible, but no later than the first meeting following collection."
- Auxiliary Presidents should monitor the committee's progress and encourage the committee to continue to contact those members that did not renew last year and get them reinstated. The more members we have, the louder our voice will be on Capitol Hill when we lobby for veterans' entitlements. And, of course, we want to be 100% + by December 31st.

- ATTENTION AUXILIARY TREASURERS: Reminder National does not send out Dues Notices. Have you sent out Dues Notices for members in your Auxiliary? If not go to Malta and send notices before the busiest season of the Holidays are upon us.
- ATTENTION AUXILIARY TREASURERS: Please send to Department Treasurer, Debbie Martin, 539 Westwood Drive, Ruckersville, VA 22968, New Members, Rejoin Members and Transfer Members as soon as you get them.
- Please make sure you have your last transmittal for 2020 to Department Treasurer Debbie Martin or enter into MALTA by December 28, 2019. This will give our Department Treasurer ample time to make sure that National has our dues by December 31, 2019. Late transmittals may not get processed in time – but send Membership in immediately upon receipt or enter into MALTA use "Overnight" mail if necessary
- HOSPITAL AND VAVS PROGRAM: Our volunteers play an important role in the medical facilities and nursing home, especially during the holiday season. We need to provide something special for our hospitalized veterans this holiday season. Many of our veterans are hospitalized far away from their homes and families; many need a smiling face and a pat on the back to make their day a little better. Now is the time for your Auxiliary to schedule and plan your parties at the hospitals and nursing homes for those men and women who have given so much to our country.
- VAVS AND HOSPITAL REPRESENTATIVES: Are reminded to account for all hospital funds they
 receive and expend. This means a Representative is to record her receipts and disbursements in
 books used for this purpose, such as books used by a Treasurer. Her books must be submitted for
 audit at the same time the books of the Department Treasurer are audited.
- PEARL HARBOR DAY: Please help plan or participate in a program for December 7th, Pearl Harbor Day, to honor all veterans who sacrificed so much for the freedom of this country. Flags should be flown at half-staff all day on December 7th to honor those veterans who went above and beyond the call of duty. If we remember that we are "United by Love for Our Veterans and Country" then we will "Honor, Respect and Remember our Veterans".

TREASURER TALK

The year is almost half over but there is still worked to be done. The treasurers are very important to this organization and you all are doing a GREAT JOB!

Just a few reminders for you:

1. Please send me a copy of ACCEPTED receipt for the Auxiliary 990-N

2. Be sure that all Auxiliary checks sent to me are made out to "VFW Auxiliary Dept. of Virginia". Not Debbie Martin, Treasurer.

3. Make sure that you have two signatures on the check.

4. Please make sure that a new member application has the Auxiliary number, city, state, date of birth, recruiter with the recruiter membership number and the obligation signed at the bottom. **These are some of the things most left off the application!**

5. There seems to be some confusion regarding the restricted and unrestricted funds and what you as the treasurer need to have. Section 813 A of the Bylaws explains this in detail. The basic auxiliary funds are:

- **General Fund:** contains unrestricted monies, which may be expended for any purpose.
- **Relief Fund:** contains restricted monies (see page 20 of the booklet of instruction)
 - Yellow pages of the Bylaws and Ritual.

Dues Fund: contains restricted monies for National and Department dues

The auxiliary can have a Cancer Insurance Fund, Kitchen Fund, Bingo Fund and so forth.

The monies in these accounts are restricted funds and can only used for the purposes for which they were received.

Thank you for all that you do!! Remember to leave no member behind.

Keep up the wonderful job that you are doing and with Your help the Department of Virginia will continue to assist our veterans, troops and families.

Did you have or are you planning an outstanding patriotic project? I would like to hear from you with pictures and descriptions of the event. The deadline is April 30, 2020. Your Auxiliary could do a project like a Family Freedom Festival or Patriotic Parade. Do you have other ideas?

I am pleased to see so many videos and pictures on social medial of your events especially during the Veteran's special days in November. Contact local newspapers, television and radio to publicize your event. Upcoming is December 7th, Pearl Harbor Day. This day we remember the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941.

We must keep our Auxiliary Traditions and help new member to understand and use them.

Go to VFWAuxiliary.org/resources; click on MALTA member Login; Login to MALTA using your Auxiliary member number and password; click on resources; scroll down to "Understanding Auxiliary Traditions, Video or PDF". Here there is excellent information to give to members so they may understand what we do in our in meetings.

Understanding Auxiliary Traditions:

Helping our new members: Ask if they have any questions, mentor them.

When Entering a meeting: At local Auxiliary meetings, show your card once the doors are closed.

At Department or National meetings, show your membership card at the door

AMERICANISM

Raps of the gavel: One rap = Attention Two raps = Rise Three raps = Be seated

Attention and Parade Rest: "Attention" in the VFW Auxiliary means hands at side, head up with eyes looking forward, no talking,

"Parade Rest" means the left foot moves slightly to the side while bringing the arms to the small of the back. Clasp the left thumb in the right hand. The head is slightly bowed during prayer.

Showing Proper Respect to the Flag: During our Ritualistic meeting, the President will say,

"Salute" when the Flag enters or leaves the room and during the "Pledge of Allegiance" and National Anthem by placing the right hand flat over the heart. Heart or Military salute is used at all times in during Auxiliary meetings. When Flag is present face the Flag and when there is no Flag, face the music. Members should stand when the Flag is moving.

Showing proper respect for the Alter and Bible:

Members will remain seated while the Chaplain opens and closes the Bible. While the Chaplain is opening or closing the Bible everyone should stop movement and talking.

Members should not cross between the President's Station and the Alter, as this is considered sacred ground symbolizing where our Comrades who have answered the final roll call are at rest. However, when the Bible is closed, member may pass through this area.

Addressing the President and Making a Motion: All remarks must be addressed to the President and not one member to another. A member wishing to address the President will rise and say, "Mister/Madam President," but shall not speak further until he or she has been recognized by the President.

Making motions is your right as a member. To make a motion, you should stand and be recognized by the President and then proceed

Each month we talk about Legislative Bills that the VFW is fighting to help pass. The Bills are

Widows Tax, Burn Pits, Veterans Health Care, Vocational Rehabilitation & Employment Program and Transition. We keep telling you to follow these bills and reach out to your House of Representatives and Senators to let them know you want these issues supported.

Do you know how bill gets its start? Do you remember the School House Rock Show?



The song about the bill is on YouTube.

This is the basic life of a bill: It starts as an idea. The idea may come from a Representative of the House or a citizen. Citizens must contact their Representatives to get their support. If the idea is agreed on the Representative will research the idea and write the bill. After the representative writes the bill it needs sponsors, once the bill has sponsors and support it is introduced to the U.S. House of Representatives. Only Representatives can introduce bills in the U.S. House of Representatives. When a bill is introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives, a bill clerk assigns it a number that begins with H.R. A reading clerk then reads the bill to all the Representatives and the Speaker of the House sends the bill to one of the House standing committees. When the bill reaches a committee, the members, groups of Representatives that are experts on topics. They then review, research and revise before voting on whether or not to send the bill back to the House floor. If the committee members would like more information before deciding if the bill should go to the House floor, the bill is sent to a subcommittee where more information is gathered for the bill and it is sent back to the committee for approval.

When the committee has approved a bill, it is reported to the House floor. Once reported the bill is ready to be debated by the U.S. House of Representatives. Which means a reading clerk reads the bill section by section and the bill is discussed by the Representatives, this is where changes are made to the bill. Then the bill is ready to vote on.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

There are three methods a bill is voted on - A voice vote, Division (the speaker ask supporters to stand and they are counted), Recorded (using an electronic voting system). If a majority of the representatives approve the bill it passes the house, a clerk certifies the bill and it is delivered to the U.S. Senate. Here the bill is assigned a number starting with an S and the bill goes through many of the same steps it went through in the House. Senators vote by voice, if the bill passes the Senate then it goes to the President.

When the bill reaches the President, he has three choices:

Sign and Pass the bill and it becomes a law.

Veto the bill and it is sent back to the House along with the President's reason for the veto. If the House and Senate believe the bill should become a law, they can hold another vote on the bill. If two-thirds of the House and Senate Representatives vote in favor of the bill it then becomes a law.

Do nothing (pocket veto) if congress is in session, the bill automatically becomes a law after 10 days. If congress is not in session the bill does not become a law. If the bill is passed by the House, Senate and President then the bill becomes a law and is enforced by the government. Information taken from Kids in the House. Collect the information about your Auxiliary-approved events and projects and report as soon as possible so that you don't forget anything or if you will like you can report once a month. If you do not have an event or project in a Program for the month then DO NOT send in a report with zeros. A blank report or one with zeros does not count as a report.

I have heard many people say "We did not like to brag". Reporting is not bragging. Reporting to Department is one way of telling the story of your Auxiliary and then from Department to National helps the organization tell its story as a whole.

Please report to me and let me know how your Auxiliary is mentoring. Auxiliary 1503 is now handing out New Member bags to our new members that attend the meeting. We have included in the bag, a welcome letter, membership pin, podium edition, the Fact Sheet that we got from National Headquarters, eligibility wheel, membership application, the Auxiliary Traditions from National Headquarters website and one of the blue card cases from the VFW Store. PRESIDENTS SPECIAL PROJECT

VFW VIRGINIA SERVICE OFFICE RPROGRAM

The VFW Service Officer Program is a small group of dedicated men and women that do the paperwork, give advice, make the arguments for veterans to get their benefits from the Veterans Administration (VA). This includes health care, compensation for health issues, home loans, education, life insurance, and much more. The program represents veterans at all levels of the VA including any appeals needed. The Service Officers also represent widows and dependents.

Through the efforts of the staff, over 1,500 claims were filed where the veterans received benefits worth \$27,324,695.

The Program

The Service Officer Program in the Department of Virginia is composed of four accredited staffers and a secretary. The staff has offices in Hopewell, Staunton, Dale City, Norfolk.

Veterans Compensation is covered by Title 38 of the U.S.Code. This law is over 1200 pages that define what a veteran and the VA must do to ensure a disabled veteran and/or the dependent/widow/widower is afforded the benefits provided for by law. Our service officers spend hours with this manual to properly represent veterans. Additionally, there are over 135 forms that service officers must be familiar with to properly represent our veterans and dependents.

What We Have Done

Our goal is to raise at least \$10,000 to help the Department Service Officer Program. As of this communication we are over one-third of the way to our goal and nearly half of the Auxiliaries have reported. Thank you to all the Auxiliaries that have reported. Keep the donations and reports coming.

Service Officer Training: For all of you who have expressed interest in assisting veterans and your Post Service Officer with VA Claims there will be training offered by the State Service Officer, Betty Jo Lazo, at the winter conference. Times and location will be published at a later date as soon as it is available.
