SUBJECT: Official Ruling-National Bylaws, Section 809B (add a minor bullet to the fourth

major bullet and verbiage to allow Department President to remove an Auxiliary President in a Department that does not have Districts); and 809C-County Council and District (add a fifth major bullet and verbiage to allow the Department President to remove a District President with the concurrence of the Department

Chief of Staff and the Department Sr. Vice President)

This is official correspondence to read on the Auxiliary floor.

Inasmuch as the National Bylaws do not provide for the removal of a District President by the Department President for failure to fulfill the duties of the office of District President nor do the Bylaws provide for an Auxiliary President in a Department without Districts to be removed by the Department President as there is no District President to concur with the removal; therefore, National President Peggy Haake has issued an official ruling that adds the following verbiage to Section 809B and Section 809C, respectively:

Add a minor bullet following the fourth bullet to Section 809B which shall read as follows: *An Auxiliary President in a Department without Districts may be removed by the Department President with the written concurrence of the Department Chief of Staff and the Department Sr. Vice President. When removed by the Department President, an Auxiliary President in a Department without Districts shall have the privilege of submitting an appeal to the Department Council of Administration within thirty (30) days from the date of the order declaring such office vacant."

Add a fifth (5th) major bullet to Section 809C which shall read as follows: "A District President may be removed by the Department President with the written concurrence of the Department Chief of Staff and the Department Sr. Vice President. When removed by the Department President, the District President shall have the privilege of submitting an appeal to the Department Council of Administration within thirty (30) days from the date of the order declaring such office vacant."

This ruling is effective immediately.

Department Presidents, Department Secretaries, and Department Treasurers shall inform their VFW Auxiliaries of this ruling.

A Clarification to October 11, 2019 Ruling

On October 11, 2019, an Official Ruling went out concerning Departments without Districts and the ability of the Department President to remove officers.

There was some concern about this being a direct change to our Bylaws. It was not meant to be. The Sections were mentioned so you could easily locate where in the Bylaws this omission occurred. National President Peggy Haake is recalling this Ruling and replacing it with the attached ruling dated October 21, 2019. We felt in order to protect our members rights there should be a concurence, as there is for Departments with Districts. Since there is no provision for anyone else to concur with the Department President other than the District President, we felt this needed to be addressed. Please see below the difference between a Resolution, a Bylaw suggestion and a Ruling. We hope this will help to clarify things.

The difference between a Resolution, a Bylaw change suggestion and a Ruling

- A Resolution is made and voted on per the Bylaws and submitted to National Headquarters.
 As long as it is submitted properly and timely, the committee will recommend to adopt or not to adopt. The Resolution would then be voted on by the delegates in attendance.
- 2.) A Bylaw change suggestion, is something you think should be clarified, added or omitted from the Bylaws. The recommendation would be sent to National Headquarters for consideration. The Bylaws committee will look over all the suggestions and if they deem it as something the body should consider, they will make it part of their presentation and it would then be voted on by the convention delegates. A recommendation is just that, a recommendation and it may or may not be brought before the convention.
- 3.) A Ruling is something that is not specifically addressed in the Bylaws and may need to be, either because of a difference of opinion as to how it reads or it is an omission. Rulings are sometimes used to make a needed resolution. A ruling will stay in effect until reversed or made into a resolution and voted on. We would not vote on a ruling. We only vote on proposed resolutions. A ruling can be temporary and is not meant to change the Bylaws in a permanent fashion. I.e. We added an optional official cap to our uniform look. However, we did not add anything to our Bylaws about when it should be removed. (I.e. during the prayer or pledge) We received lots of questions about this, so we made a ruling, so we could all follow the same directive. I am sure a resolution will be put forth this year to address this oversight.

SUBJECT: National President Peggy Haake-Official Ruling

This is official correspondence to read on the Auxiliary floor.

Inasmuch as the National Bylaws do not provide for the removal of a District President by the Department President for failure to fulfill the duties of the office of District President nor do the Bylaws provide for any elected Auxiliary Officer in a Department without Districts to be removed by the Department President as there is no District President to concur with the removal; therefore, National President Peggy Haake has issued the following official ruling:

"A Department President may declare vacant the office of any elected Auxiliary Officer in a Department without Districts for failure to fulfill the duties of their office with the written concurrence of the Department Chief of Staff and the Department Sr. Vice President. When so removed by the Department President, any elected Auxiliary Officer in a Department without Districts shall have the privilege of submitting an appeal to the Department Council of Administration within thirty (30) days from the date of the order declaring such office vacant."

"A Department President may declare vacant the office of a District President for failure to fulfill the duties of their office with the written concurrence of the Department Chief of Staff and the Department Sr. Vice President. When so removed by the Department President, the District President shall have the privilege of submitting an appeal to the Department Council of Administration within thirty (30) days from the date of the order declaring such office vacant."

This ruling is effective immediately.

Department Presidents, Department Secretaries, and Department Treasurers shall inform their VFW Auxiliaries of this ruling.

- RECRUITING IS A MEMBERSHIP OBLIGATION: Our goal is to be 100% plus one member in membership by December 31, 2019. If each of you asks 5 who are eligible for membership, you each will end up with at least one new member. Practicing your recruiting technique will give you confidence. Be sure to explain what the Auxiliary does and what it stands for. Be enthusiastic and sincere in your approach. Make potential members feel that they will be a vital part of this organization because they will be! Members must be citizens of the United States or a United States National, and at least 16 years old. Those eligible are:
- Husband/Wife
- Widower/Widow
- Father/Mother
- Grandfathers/Grandmothers
- Sons/Daughters
- Grandsons/Granddaughters
- Brothers/Sisters

You can order the new fact sheets from National Headquarters to use for recruiting.

- **SECTION 104, MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING:** The membership year of the Auxiliary is from January 1 to December 31.
 - A member who has paid their dues to December 31 is in good standing.
 - A member ceases to be in good standing on January 1 immediately following the year for which dues have been paid.
 - A member shall not again be in good standing until their dues have been paid for the current year.
 - Dues must be paid by June 30 to remain a continuous member.
 - Prior year's dues may not be paid after July 1.
 - Any member who has not maintained continuous membership shall submit an application and be accepted in the same manner as a new member.
 - o No admission fee shall be required.
 - Continuous membership begins again upon payment of dues.
 - Date of rejoin starts new continuous membership timeline.



Must be read by the Auxiliary Secretary or printed and distributed at the first meeting following receipt before being filed for reference.

- **SECTION 106, TRANSFERS:** Applicants who wish to transfer between Auxiliaries need not show proof of eligibility but instead must provide their current membership card as this proves eligibility has been established and approved with their current Auxiliary or as a Member at Large.
- **ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS:** I would like to remind all members that when spending Auxiliary money, you must first have an approved motion to spend and must turn in all receipts for any money spent. Any money given to you that was not spent must be returned to the Treasurer upon completion of the project. Be sure to get a receipt. The Treasurer at any level should have proper receipts to back up any checks written.
- ATTENTION VAVS REPRESENTATIVES AND DEPUTIES: Please make sure that you submit a voucher to the Department Treasurer for your first quarter expenses for July 1, 2019 until September 30, 2019 for your visit to the VA Hospital. Vouchers should be submitted in the quarter in which travel was completed as this makes managing the budget and the job of the Trustees and Treasurer easier. Also, assist your Department Hospital & VAVS Program Chairman by helping her with the Outstanding Hospital Volunteer National Award.
- **VETERANS DAY, NOVEMBER 11, 2019:** Has your Auxiliary planned a Veterans Day Ceremony? Coordinate with your Post Commander to share in the preparation, and expense of a Veterans Day Ceremony. Encourage your members to participate in honoring all veterans those who have stood guard in peacetime, those who have seen the terrors and inhumanity of combat, and those who paid the ultimate sacrifice.
- **NATIONAL PRESIDENT VISIT:** National President Peggy Haake will visit Virginia November 13-16, 2019. Please see Flyer in this communication and reserve your spot to attend today.

Raps of the Gavel

- On rap = Attention, in the VFW Auxiliary this means that you stand, with your hands straight down at sides and head up looking straight forward
- Two Raps = stand (clue: 2 raps U P)
- Three Raps = be seated (clue: 3 raps S I T)

Showing proper Respect for the Flag

Please refer to Podium Edition Bylaws and Ritual Book Effective date August 21, 2015.

The American Flag is placed on the floor and level to the right of the presiding officer at all times. During Auxiliary meetings, when salute is used, Members of the Auxiliary shall rise; Heart or Military Salute is made facing American Flag. Patriotic Instructor shall see that the pledge to the Flag is given properly and that respect to the Flag is given at all times.

And don't forget about the Outstanding Hospital Volunteer of the Year Award who has served from March 1, 2019 to February 28, 2020. 

The VFW Service Officer Program is a small group of dedicated men and women that do the paperwork, give advice, make the arguments for veterans to get their benefits from the Veterans Administration (VA). This includes health care, compensation for health issues, home loans, education, life insurance, and much more. The program represents veterans at all levels of the VA including any appeals needed. The Service Officers also represent widows and dependents.

Through the efforts of the staff, over 1,500 claims were filed where the veterans received benefits worth \$27,324,695.

The Program

The Service Officer Program in the Department of Virginia is composed of four accredited staffers and a secretary. The staff has offices in Hopewell, Staunton, Dale City, Norfolk.

Veterans Compensation is covered by Title 38 of the U.S. Code. This law is over 1200 pages that define what a veteran and the VA must do to ensure a disabled veteran and/or the dependent/widow/widower is afforded the benefits provided for by law. Our service officers spend hours with this manual to properly represent veterans. Additionally, there are over 135 forms that service officers must be familiar with to properly represent our veterans and dependents. What We Have Done

Our goal is to raise at least \$10,000 to help the Department Service Officer Program. As of October 25th, we have raised \$3,480.00. Thank you to all the Auxiliaries that have reported.

If your Post/Auxiliary has our State Winner, plan on attending the Winter Council meeting in January to watch them receive their State Award.

Continuing Education Scholarship

Don't forget this scholarship is special, it is only for an Auxiliary member, spouse, sons and/or daughters. You must have been a member for at least one year, and the applicant must be at 18 years old. Application must be to National Headquarters by February 15, 2020. Every Auxiliary should be reported in this scholarship. I am looking forward to your reports. All you need to do is bring up the guidelines at one of your Auxiliary meetings.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest

The National Auxiliary is accepting donations for the Young American Creative Art Escrow Fund. There is a need to increase the funding so that we can offer more incentive to students to get involved. In order to receive credit for your donation, the deadline is April 30, 2020 The deadline for the contest is March 31, 2020, so it is not too late if you have not offered this to your high school students.

$VETERANS \ & FAMILY SUPPORT$

Dear Members, last month I talked about the Unmet Needs Program and this month the National Ambassador for Veterans and Family Support highlighted the Unmet Needs Program in her promotion so I will provide some additional information that you can share with your auxiliaries.

The applicant for the grant of up to \$1,500 must be either the service member, veteran or eligible dependent listed under the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Report System (DEERS). The financial hardship must be due to one of the following:

- Currently on active duty, the financial hardship is a result of current deployment, military pay error or from being discharged for medical reasons.
- Discharged on or after September 11, 2001, whose financial hardship is a direct result of military service connected injuries and/or illness.
- Discharged prior to September 11, 2001, are on a fixed income (VA compensation, SSI, SSDI) and/or the financial hardship is an emergency situation.
